<u>Jaunā Teika</u>: a new district in Riga including multi-apartment buildings, office buildings. During the construction process special attention is paid to modern technologies and the use of engineering solutions to maintain an economic use of energy resources.

<u>VEFRESH</u>: an open innovation movement launched in 2019, when VEF district technology companies joined forces with real estate developers and Riga municipality owned culture venue "VEF Kultūras pils". The movement aims to redevelop VEF district as a pilot territory for smart city solutions, where corporations, start-ups and public sector create prototypes and test their latest solutions in public space.
